Reverend's Remarks for September 2009



I can't believe summer is over! I guess it's true, "*Time goes quickly when you're having fun.*" The end of summer marks the beginning of a new school year. It is my hope everyone had an opportunity to get some much needed rest and relaxation this summer. A new school year means back to school sales, watching for children waiting for the bus, meeting your children's new teacher, stocking up on lunch box items, and getting back into the routine of things. With all that said, let me suggest a new school year also means the beginning of our Sunday School and youth group season. I can't wait to see faces glowing ready to learn something new about God.
